- → **Joint defense programs strengthen the U.S. military:** The United States and Israel co-develop missile-defense systems such as Iron Dome, David's Sling, and Arrow. Each is built in partnership with U.S. firms like Lockheed Martin, creating jobs and enhancing America's global defense edge. <u>Council on Foreign Relations</u>
- → Israel powers the U.S. economy: Trade between the two nations has grown tenfold since 1985, and Israeli-founded companies have become a cornerstone of U.S. innovation. Journalist Amit Segal noted, "Israeli-founded companies have created nearly 30,000 jobs in New York and added \$12.4 billion to the city's economy... Israeli innovation is indispensable to New York and, I'd add, to the world." According to the United States—Israel Business Alliance, those 590 companies have indirectly supported over 50,000 additional jobs, generated \$8 billion in total earnings, and contributed nearly \$20 billion to New York's gross economic output with an average salary above \$160,000.
