

Zionists Don't Hate You Because You Told the Truth, Candace; They Hate You Because You Lie

Background

- → Charlie Kirk, founder of Turning Point USA, was one of the strongest Christian Zionist voices in U.S. conservatism.
- → Charlie defended Israel's right to self-defence and frequently spoke about Judeo-Christian values.
- → The viral "Go Max" clip originated from a 2024 Turning Point USA event where Kirk spoke with Tucker Carlson backstage.
- → Megyn Kelly replayed Carlson's account of this conversation on her show on November 11, 2025.
- → After Kelly's broadcast, antisemitic agitators edited the segment and weaponized it into propaganda claiming "Zionist censorship."

Truth Explained

- → What the Conversation Was Really About: According to Tucker Carlson's own account, the "Go Max" exchange happened backstage at a former TPUSA event, where he vented about U.S. "neocons" pushing for conflict with Iran and the Epstein cover-up. Charlie Kirk encouraged Carlson to speak openly "go max" or "go all the way." The subject was foreign-policy independence and political transparency, not Israel. Megyn Kelly Show, Nov 11 2025
- → Megyn Kelly's Broadcast: On her show, Kelly replayed Carlson's story to illustrate conservative infighting over censorship and donor pressure. She made clear that Epstein's alleged intelligence ties were not proven to involve Israel, citing that both Ehud Barak and Alan Dershowitz denied it outright. Megyn Kelly Show, Nov 11 2025
- → Brandon Tatum's Corroborating Account: At a different TPUSA event, commentator Brandon Tatum said Kirk encouraged him to "go in on Epstein," reinforcing that Kirk's interest was exposing corruption not advancing any antisemitic narrative.

- → Charlie Kirk's Approach to Debate: Charlie Kirk believed that strong movements require open debate. As *Megyn Kelly* noted (Nov 11 2025) and *Fox News* confirmed (Sept 2025), he routinely invited opposing voices even critics of Israel to ensure arguments were heard and challenged respectfully, not with hostility or antisemitism.
- → How the Clip Was Distorted: After Kelly's episode aired, antisemitic influencers edited the segment to imply "Zionist control." Candace Owens amplified the lie, tweeting: "Tucker Carlson told the truth. I told the truth. Zionists hate us because we told the truth." @RealCandaceO on X, Nov 2025
- → Charlie Kirk's Actual Record on Israel: In interviews and speeches, Kirk affirmed his belief in Israel's biblical land rights and described the country as "a model of Western civilization."
