

Immigrating to Israel Is Legal. Scapegoating Jews Isn't.

The Lie:

→ A synagogue event about Jews immigrating to Israel is "illegal" and helps "promote violations of international law."

The Truth:

→ Helping Jews immigrate to Israel is legal. Targeting and intimidating Jews at a synagogue is not.

Background:

- → On Nov 19, 2025, Park East Synagogue hosted an event by Nefesh B'Nefesh, an organization that facilitates immigration to Israel for North American Jews.
- → Anti-Israel protesters gathered outside the synagogue, directing chants toward Jews participating in an informational event about immigrating to Israel.
- → Mayor-elect Zohran Mamdani condemned the Jews inside the synagogue—not the mob outside.

Truth: Explained

- → On Nov 19, protesters surrounded Park East Synagogue, shouting "make them scared," "globalize the intifada," and "take another settler out," directly targeting Jews attending a basic immigration-information event.

- → While Mamdani's office said he "discouraged the language used at last night's protest," his spokesperson's only concrete accusation targeted the Jews inside the synagogue alleging their aliyah event "promot[ed] activities in violation of international law." https://www.jpost.com/diaspora/antisemitism/article-874702?utm_source=chatgpt.com
- → Mamdani's claim is legally baseless and dangerously inverted.
 - City Journal notes this "bizarre theory" would turn Jews exploring aliyah into criminals while excusing those intimidating them outside a house of worship.

- → Immigrating to another country is a fundamental civil right and for many Jews, choosing Israel is also tied to religious freedom and communal identity. The Park East event was simply an informational session for Jews considering a legal move. - → Nefesh B'Nefesh is an immigration-support NGO—not a political or territorial actor.
 - It helps new immigrants with visas, healthcare enrollment, school registration, and job placement. It does *not* buy, sell, or broker land; does *not* engage in real estate; and promotes *no* geographic or political agenda.

- → Aliyah is not illegal under any UN resolution, ICJ opinion, or treaty.
 - Even the UN, known to be hostile to Israeli policy, has *never once* claimed Jewish immigration violates international law. The Oct 2024 UN COI statement concerns *state obligations* (diplomatic recognition, military aid). It says nothing about private immigration or NGOs. https://news.un.org/en/story/2024/10/1151097
- → International law explicitly recognized the legality of Jewish immigration.
 - The 1922 League of Nations Mandate required the Mandatory to *facilitate Jewish immigration*. Article 80 of the UN Charter preserved those rights. No later UN action nullified them. https://icfa.org/article/the-state-of-israels-legal-right-to-iudea-and-samaria/
